

ESC FIELD MARSHAL DUTIES

1. When arriving for your shift you will need to report to Pauline Byars at the North concession.
2. No pets! No smoking! No glass containers! No Alcohol! (ESC Complex rules)
3. Position yourself in your assigned area and watch the fields you are responsible for:
 - A) If there is an injured player, radio for a medic. ****Please tell them what field # and what part of the field. Example "I need a medic on field #11, North side line white team."**
 - B) If parents or coaches are getting out of hand, radio for tournament staff. We want to try and prevent problems before they get too heated. You may walk over and position yourself on that sideline to help matters.
 - C) Teams are responsible for picking up trash on their sideline at the conclusion of their game. Please just try and give a quick reminder to the coaches at the end of their game.
 - D) Any player or coach that receives a RED card must be picked up by Tournament Staff and taken directly to tournament headquarters.
 - E) Be aware of any referees that may need Tournament Staff (as they are instructed to find a Field Marshal if they need help) or if a coach has asked for someone from Tournament Staff to come to the field.
4. If you see a hole in a net, hole on the field or a trash can that needs immediate emptying, please radio for Tournament Staff.
5. You may have people asking you for directions to a field, please familiarize yourself with the field locations.
6. Notify referee's when a game is finished. Example "Game on Field # 2 is finished." We do not need to know the score or who won. This is so the referees can be picked up. Also notify referees if a game is ready to begin but there is NOT a full referee crew at the field.
7. In the event of bad weather, the Tournament Director will communicate with Field Marshal's to help pass on information. There will also be an air horn that will go off to inform tournament participants. ****If Tournament Director requests that the fields be cleared, teams DO NOT have an option and MUST immediately return to their vehicles. We will then notify them by air horn and Tournament Staff letting everyone know that it is ok to return to the fields and resume play. *One long blast* from the air horn means clear the field. *Two short blasts* mean that players and parents can return to the fields. *Three short blasts* from the air horn mean that there is a missing child and we are on a lock down – No one can enter or leave the complex. Field Marshals should report to the nearest gate so that people can NOT enter or leave the fields to the parking lot. *Four short air horn blasts* means that the child has been found and resume to your field position.**

*****Please remember to keep the radios clear unless you are communicating necessary information. The radio's needs to be kept clear as much as possible in case of emergency or other regular needed information.**

At the conclusion of your shift, another person will come and relieve you. Please wait in your area until that person arrives. If it is the end of your shift and no one has come to relieve you, please radio for Tournament Staff and ask if someone is on the way or if you should bring your radio and vest to the North Concession.

If you see any handicapped person, senior citizen or someone that may need assistance getting to/from a field, please radio for Tournament Staff.
